

Shoal Bay carpark upgrades

We're upgrading the Shoal Bay carpark on Government Road to make it more accessible and environmentally friendly. The new design includes 100 sealed and line-marked spaces, rain gardens, and a shared path to the Holiday Park.

Sustainable tree management

As part of the carpark upgrades, we'll create a more sustainable green space.

To achieve this, we'll be removing the non-native trees from the carpark and 5 of the existing native trees however, we'll be replanting 8 new, advanced native trees in their place. Refer to the map overpage to see the tree placement as part of the upgrades.

The removal of existing trees will reduce the impact of tree roots on drainage and the parking surface, reduce the risk of damage from falling branches and allow more efficient parking and traffic flow.

Construction timeline

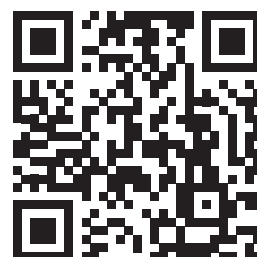
Construction is set to begin in mid-2025 and will take approximately 12 weeks. During construction, onsite parking won't be available. We recommend using existing on-street parking in and around Shoal Bay.

The upgraded carpark will continue to feature smart parking technology, with a similar installation to the existing system.

The carpark currently has 28 mature trees, with 6 being natives. We'll remove all non-native trees and 5 of the native ones within the parking area.
